Long-Term Care in Indian Country

- A broad range of personal, social and medical services that assist people who have functional or cognitive limitations in their ability to perform self-care and other activities necessary to live independently.
- Support of family caregivers.
- In Tribal communities, it also includes the importance of maintaining cultural values in the delivery system.

- Informal Care – primarily family and community supports
- Formal home and community based care
- Institutional


What are Home and Community Based Services?


