You don't have to wait to get your Medicare information in the mail

No need to wait months to get paper copies of your Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs) —just log into your secure Medicare account at Medicare.gov/account and sign up for electronic MSNs. Every month you have claims, you'll get an email with a secure link to your electronic MSN.

You can also sign up to get the "Medicare & You" electronic handbook. The online version is updated throughout the year so you'll always have the most up-to-date information. It's also searchable, and you can view it anywhere you take your electronic device (like at your doctor's office).

If you need to save, print, or share Medicare information with a trusted representative (like a close family member), you'll have control over that information with your online account.

Access your Medicare information anytime with a secure Medicare account

Your secure online Medicare account lets you access your Medicare documents around the clock. Browse your Medicare Summary Notices, track your claims faster, and get important updates, all in one secure place.

Scan the QR code below or visit <u>Medicare.gov</u> to create your secure Medicare account any time after you have your Medicare Number. If you already have a Medicare.gov account, just log in.

Once logged in to your Medicare.gov account, go to "My Account Settings" and change your handbook delivery preference to "Electronically" and your Medicare Summary Notices (claims information) to "Electronic."
