
Flu Vaccination Among the Medicare Population

This infographic shows annual flu shot coverage among Medicare beneficiaries living in the community in 2020.

The MCBS is a nationally representative survey of Medicare beneficiaries sponsored by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and directed by the Office of Enterprise Data and Analytics (OEDA) of the CMS. The MCBS is authorized by section 1875 (42 USC 139511) of the Social Security Act and is conducted by NORC at the University of Chicago for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The OMB Number for this survey is 0938-0568. This communication was printed, published, or produced and disseminated at U.S. taxpayer expense.

Estimates are based on the 2020 MCBS Preventive Care Public Use File (PUF) and represent the population of beneficiaries who were ever enrolled in Medicare in 2020 and completed an interview in Winter 2021 or Summer 2021. The dataset includes 14,086 beneficiaries (weighted N = 60,403,699).
