Action Needed

Make sure your billing staffs know:

- Hospitals may open a new IRF unit at any time during the cost reporting year
- Any IRF unit excluded during a cost reporting year will stay excluded for the rest of the cost reporting year

Background

CR 13587 updates IRF policies per the FY 2024 IRF Prospective Payment System (PPS) <u>final</u> rule (88 FR 68494). The manual modifications in CR 13587 are to Section 140 of the Medicare Claims Processing Manual, <u>Chapter 3</u>.

The updated requirements allow a hospital to open a new IRF unit anytime within the cost reporting year if it notifies:

- The CMS Regional Office of Program Operations and Local Engagement (OPOLE)
- Its Medicare Administrative Contractor (MAC)

The notifications must be in writing at least 30 days before the change date. Additionally, if a unit becomes excluded during a cost reporting year, this change will remain in effect for the rest of the cost reporting year.

Other manual updates are reminders for IRFs and include:

- Starting with the second week of admission to the IRF, a non-physician practitioner (NPP) who the IRF knows has specialized training and experience in inpatient rehabilitation may conduct 1 of the 3 required face-to-face visits with the patient per week, if such duties are within the NPP's scope of practice under applicable state law.
- A new IRF has a compliance review period that starts immediately when its cost reporting period starts, and ends 4 months before the start of its next cost reporting period. For example, a new IRF has a cost reporting period that starts on July 1, 2022, so its compliance review period would start on July 1, 2022, and end on February 28, 2023.
