Consistent with subdivision (A) following the last paragraph of section 1905(a) of the Social Security Act (the Act), optional coverage for eligible juveniles as defined in 1902(nn) (individuals who are under 21 years of age and determined eligible for any Medicaid eligibility group, or individuals determined eligible for the mandatory eligibility group for former foster care children age 18 up to age 26, immediately before becoming an inmate of a public institution or while an inmate of a public institution) while such individuals are inmates of a public institution, pending disposition of charges. For Medicaid beneficiaries under the age of 21, this includes all medically necessary section 1905(a) services provided in accordance with the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment requirements as outlined in section 1905(r) of the Act, and any additional services as covered in the state plan, waiver of such state plan, and/or 1115 demonstration project for which a beneficiary is entitled. For former foster care youth ages 21-26, this includes all Medicaid mandatory and optional benefits provided to adults in the state plan, waiver of such state plan, and/or 1115 demonstration project for which a beneficiary is entitled.
