New year, new savings on insulin! New insulin savings in #Medicare Part D coverage means you'll pay no more than \$35 for a month's supply of each covered insulin. Learn more: [www.medicare.gov/coverage/insulin](https://www.medicare.gov/coverage/insulin)

As of Jan. 1, the cost of a 1-month supply of each Part D-covered insulin you take is capped at \$35, and you won't have to pay a deductible.
