01	<p><u>Section 6: ICD-10-CM Codes Related to Specific Impairment Groups, Page 1:</u></p> <p>The introduction to Section 6 does not reflect the fact that there are now 3 spaces provided in Item 22 – Etiologic Diagnosis.</p>	<p>The introduction is changed to:</p> <p>The Impairment Group Code (IGC) represents the primary condition for which the patient requires treatment in an IRF. The patient's IGC should be filled in at item 21 of the IRF-PAI. The Etiologic Diagnosis is the problem that led to the condition represented by the IGC, and should be filled in at Item 22 using one or more ICD codes (according to ICD-10-CM coding guidelines). The table on the following page provides a crosswalk for mapping a particular Etiologic Diagnosis to an IGC. Additionally, the chart provides information on what Rehabilitation Impairment Category (RIC) an IGC will be assigned to for payment purposes. The presence of an ICD code (or the IGC) in this table does not mean that the Etiologic Diagnosis (or the IGC) meets the criteria for admission to an IRF. Additionally, it does not imply that the Etiologic Diagnosis (or the IGC) will meet the IRF 60 percent rule requirements.</p> <p>The presence of a code in this table signifies a potential diagnosis a patient could receive. 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02	<u>Section 6: ICD-10-CM Codes Related to Specific Impairment Groups, Page 27:</u> The ICD-10 diagnosis codes listed as examples under the note “Gangrene (<i>Use additional code to identify underlying disease—</i>)” are indicated as exclusions in the ICD-10-CM official code set for some of the ICD-10 codes (Item 22) listed for Gangrene. 03	<u>Section 6: ICD-10-CM Codes Related to Specific Impairment Groups, Page 36:</u> The definition of ICD-10-CM code T07 in Section 6 was inadvertently carried over from a previous version of Section 6 that contained ICD-9-CM codes.	The definition of T07 is changed to: T07 Unspecified multiple injuries.		This change is effective in the IRF-PAI training manual for 10-01-2015.
04	<u>Section 6: ICD-10-CM Codes Related to Specific Impairment Groups, Page 41:</u> The definition of Major Multiple Trauma (14) provided the previous guidance to code one primary trauma under Item 22 – Etiologic Diagnosis and a secondary trauma under Item 24 – Comorbid Conditions. This guidance does not reflect the fact that there are now 3 spaces provided in Item 22 – Etiologic Diagnosis.	The definition of Major Multiple Trauma (14) is changed to: “Includes TRAUMA cases with more COMPLEX management due to involvement of multiple systems or sites. Enter the ICD-10 code(s) for the primary trauma in Item 22 – Etiologic Diagnosis, using one or more of the spaces provided (according to ICD-10-CM coding guidelines), and ICD-10 code(s) for the secondary trauma in Item 24 – Comorbid Conditions.”		This change is effective in the IRF-PAI training manual for 10-01-2015.
05	<u>Section 11: Clarification of Terminology, Page 3,</u> The definition of Etiologic Diagnosis does not reflect the fact that there are now 3 spaces provided in Item 22 – Etiologic Diagnosis.	The definition of Etiologic Diagnosis is changed to: Enter the ICD code(s) (according to ICD-10-CM coding guidelines) to indicate the etiologic problem that led to the impairment for which the patient is receiving rehabilitation (Item 21 – Impairment Group).		This change is effective in the IRF-PAI training manual for 10-01-2015.
